- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 5 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 8 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

This Collaboration Agreement may be terminated on the following grounds:

- End of stipulated period of validity.
- Mutual agreement between the parties.
- Written notice of termination with 6 months in advance, provided the termination shall not become effective until the end of the stay of the students enrolled in both institutions on the date of notification.

2.- Universitat de Girona will send its decision within 2 weeks from the student's application date.

3.-Transcript of records

Universitat de Girona issues the Transcript of Records according to the final mark submission date. That means:

For the 1st semester students (Autumn term, from Sept. to February): 1rst half of March

For the 2nd semester students (Spring term, from February to June): 1rst half of July For the whole academic year (from Sept. to June 2014): 1rst half of July

In the Spanish university system, ratings are based on the total score of 10 points, with one decimal allowed, obtained by the student in each subject, according to the following scale: Fail (SS): 0-4.9. Pass (AP): 5 to 6.9. Good (NT): 7 to 8.9. Excellent (SB): 9-10.

Honors: involves having obtained more outstanding special mention. They only may be awarded to students who have achieved a score equal to or greater than 9.0

A subject is considered overcome from Pass (5).
