may be done in the same way. Termination of the agreement: at least one year advance notice before the start of the following academic year is necessary for unilateral termination of the agreement. All students and staff who have already been admitted to bilateral exchange projects will be allowed to finish their projects as foreseen.

Nature of the agreement: The above parties agree to cooperate in the activities shown. This is an agreement of cooperation and exchange where both parties agree to make use of the ERASMUS programme wherever applicable in order to facilitate the co-operation. Both parties undertake to abide by the bilaterally agreed terms of this co-operation agreement and ERASMUS rules and EUC standards where applicable.

Both parties agree to provide all information necessary in order to facilitate the mobility of students and staff. The agreement is open to persons without discrimination according to ethnic background, nationality, creed, sex. Simple exchange students are exempt from tuition fees at the host institution on a mutual basis and are entitled to rights and privileges compatible with the treatment foreseen for Erasmus students.
