HEREBY DECREES

ART. 1. ACTIVATION First/Second-Level Master's Programme in Banking and Finance a.y. 2026/2027.

1.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

For the academic year 2026/2027, the First-Level Master's Programme in Banking and Finance (banking & Finance) is activated at the University of Messina for a maximum of 90 places. The Master's Programme Direction is based at the relevant Department.

The Master's Programme will be activated provided that, following the above-mentioned selection procedure, the minimum number (10) of enrolled students established by the Regulations governing advanced training courses is reached.

1.2 OBJECTIVES AND STRUCTURE OF THE MASTER'S PROGRAMME

Master's programmes are designed to provide specific knowledge and in-depth cultural insight in sectors and issues of high professional standing, ensuring optimal alignment with the labour market and the local context.

A university Master's programme lasts 12 months. To obtain the university Master's qualification, the student must have acquired 70 university credits (CFU), distributed among



teaching activities, internship activities and preparation of a final paper.

The award of the credits corresponding to the structure of the various advanced and training activities is subject to periodic and final assessments verifying the skills acquired in the areas attended.

Award of the university Master's qualification is subject to the submission of a final paper assessing the overall skills acquired, also taking into account the internship activity (stage).

The objectives and structure of the Master's Programme are described in the sheet attached to this Call.

1.3 ATTENDANCE AND INTERMEDIATE AND FINAL ASSESSMENTS

Training for students will be delivered through face-to-face lectures, also conducted through the Teams platform and/or other telematic methods, and internship activities, structured according to the indications provided in the sheet attached to this Call.

Attendance is compulsory at a rate of 75% in each subject, respectively in the theoretical and practical parts. Each educational and support activity must take place under the direct supervision of tutors appointed by the Technical-Scientific Committee, upon proposal of the Director.

The Technical-Scientific Council may decide on the suspension or exclusion of the participant if non-attendance, irregular payments or failure to pass the intermediate and final assessments is ascertained.

ART. 2. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

2.1 REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Admission to the Master's Programme is subject to possession of a first-level degree or higher qualification, a four-year degree diploma (old system), a first-level academic diploma, or another equivalent qualification or foreign qualification recognized as suitable under the regulations in force.

For the First-Level Master's Programme in Banking and Finance, the specific requirements are indicated in the sheet attached to this Call.

Under penalty of exclusion, the candidate must certify possession of the aforementioned admission requirements pursuant to Presidential Decree 445/2000, as subsequently amended and supplemented, in accordance with the provisions of the following Art. 6.

All candidates are admitted conditionally. The Administration shall subsequently, and at any stage of the procedure, exclude those who do not possess the qualifications and admission



requirements provided for and/or declared in the call for applications.

2.2 PROVISIONS FOR CASES OF SIMULTANEOUS ENROLMENT IN TWO STUDY PROGRAMMES

Simultaneous enrolment in a Master's Programme and another study programme activated at this or other universities is allowed within the limits provided for by Ministerial Decree no. 930 of 29 July 2022.

Cases of compatibility are described on the page <https://www.unime.it/didattica/immatricolazioni-e-iscrizioni/contemporanea-iscrizione-due-corsi-di-istruzione-superiore>.

If one of the two study programmes has compulsory attendance, enrolment in a second study programme without attendance obligations is allowed, except for programmes in which compulsory attendance is required only for laboratory and internship activities, subject to authorization by the collegiate bodies of the two study programmes.

When registering for the selection procedure, the candidate is required to attach a self-certification concerning attendance of the first study programme, also attaching the teaching plan.

2.3 PROVISIONS FOR FOREIGN CITIZENS

Citizens of the European Union and citizens of non-EU States holding a qualification obtained at foreign universities may submit an application, provided that they hold an academic qualification comparable, in duration and content, to the Italian academic qualification required for admission. The qualification must be held within the deadlines indicated above.

RECOGNITION OF THE QUALIFICATION

If the qualification obtained abroad has not already been recognized, admission is subject, exclusively for these purposes, to the assessment of the suitability of the qualification by the Selection Committee.

In that case, the above-mentioned candidates must attach to the aforesaid application the documents useful to enable the School Council to rule on the request for suitability:

The application for admission must be accompanied by the following documentation:

- original qualification. Candidates who are citizens of Member States of the European Union may self-certify it;
- official translation into Italian, only if the qualification is not issued in English, French or Spanish. Interested parties may contact local translators and subsequently request certification of conformity of that translation from the Italian Representation competent for the territory (see <https://www.esteri.it/mae/it/servizi/italiani-all-estero/traduzione-e-legalizzazione-documenti.html>);
- legalization, issued by the authority competent to legalize the document certifying possession of the qualification. Legalization is not necessary if the country where the qualification was



obtained adheres to the Hague Convention (1961). In that case, legalization is replaced by the Apostille certifying the authenticity of the document. No legalization is required either if the qualification is issued by an institution in Belgium, Denmark, France, Ireland, Latvia (Brussels Convention 1987), Germany (Rome Convention 1969), or Austria (Vienna Convention 1975).

or

- declaration of value in loco, issued by the Italian Consular Representation competent for the territory of the foreign country to which the institution that issued the qualification belongs.

If the qualification was issued by a country whose legislation requires legalization, the Italian Embassies issue the declaration of value only after the qualification has been legalized by the competent authority of that country.

The declaration of value must include the date and degree grade, as well as information on the grading system of the academic qualification obtained in the foreign country (minimum and maximum achievable grades). Conversion of any final degree examination grade shall be carried out by the Selection Committee on the basis of the information provided by the Italian Representation in the declaration of value concerning the grading system of the country in which the qualification was obtained and the scale to which the grades refer. If it is not possible to infer such data from the documentation submitted, the Selection Committee shall assign the lowest grade ex officio.

The declaration of value may be replaced by the Diploma Supplement, drawn up according to the model of the European Commission, for academic qualifications issued by institutions in countries belonging to the European Higher Education Area.

The declaration of value may also be replaced by certifications issued by CIMEA, as the ENIC-NARIC centre for Italy, containing all the information reported in the declaration of value that is necessary for the assessment of the qualification (<https://www.cimea.it/>).

EU candidates residing anywhere and non-EU candidates lawfully residing in Italy for at least one year pursuant to Article 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, no. 286, as amended by Article 26 of Law 30 July 2002, no. 189, holding a qualification obtained abroad, are admitted under the same conditions and requirements as Italian citizens.

Alternatively, solely for the purpose of enrolment in the Master's Programme, the Commission responsible for verifying the entry requirements may recognize foreign study cycles and qualifications if the foreign qualification has all of the following characteristics:

- official first- or second-cycle qualification of the relevant foreign system, issued by an official institution of that foreign system;



- qualification that in the relevant foreign system allows access to the same second- or third-cycle programmes;
- qualification presenting the disciplinary and substantive elements corresponding to those of the Italian qualification required for admission (such as academic nature or research elements).

This procedure does not transform the foreign qualification into an Italian qualification, but merely allows access to second- or third-cycle programmes. Bilateral agreements on the matter remain unaffected.

CANDIDATES NOT RESIDENT IN ITALY

The provisions established by the regulations in force and indicated by the Ministry of University and Research apply to non-EU candidates.

The pre-enrolment application must also be submitted on the University portal (<https://universitaly-private.cineca.it/index.php/registration/firststep>) and will be validated following admission to the advanced training course.

Once the application has been validated, the candidate must submit the visa request to the competent diplomatic-consular representations, following the procedure described in more detail at the link https://universitaly-private.cineca.it/uploads/universitaly-pubblico/Circolare_2025-2026_studenti_internazionali.pdf.

2.3 CANDIDATES WITH DISABILITIES AND CANDIDATES WITH A DIAGNOSIS OF SLD

Candidates with disabilities, pursuant to Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 and subsequent amendments and additions, and candidates with specific learning disorders pursuant to Law 8 October 2010 no. 170 may benefit, for access to the places where teaching activities are carried out and/or for taking intermediate and final tests, from appropriate aids or compensatory measures, as well as additional time, upon uploading the relevant medical certification during the enrolment phase.

Candidates with disabilities or SLD residing in foreign countries who intend to make use of accommodations must submit legalized certification attesting to their disability or SLD status, issued in the country of residence, accompanied by an official translation exclusively into Italian or English.

The University bodies responsible for examining the above certifications verify that the foreign documentation attests to a condition of disability or specific learning disorder recognized under Italian law.

ART. 3. PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE SELECTION PROCESS

3.2 PROCEDURE FOR REGISTERING FOR THE SELECTION PROCESS

To participate in the admission selection for the Master's Programme, candidates must:

1. complete the application form using exclusively the "online pre-enrolment" procedure at the link <https://unime.esse3.cineca.it/Home.do>, accessible from any computer with an internet connection, by no later than the deadline indicated in paragraph 3.1, under penalty of exclusion. After that time, the procedure will be deactivated.

Applications delivered by hand or sent by post, email or certified email will not be accepted.

2. when completing the application form, pay the contribution for organizing the selection procedure in the amount of EUR 50.00 (fifty/00), using the methods provided by the PagoPA system, under penalty of exclusion. Said payment is refundable only if the Course is not activated;
3. once the procedure has been completed, it is advisable to print the application form.

The documentation listed below must be attached in .pdf format, in the spaces indicated on the esse3 platform, to the application referred to in point 1:

- ✓ self-certification concerning possession of the degree, indicating the date awarded, the degree grade and the examinations taken, from which the title of the individual subjects, the relevant SSD, the number of CFU, the examination date and the relevant grade can be



- inferred, issued pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445/2000;
- ✓ photocopy of a valid identity document, duly signed by the candidate;
 - ✓ self-certification concerning simultaneous attendance of another study programme for those intending to attend the Master's Programme as a second course, issued pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445/2000;
 - ✓ self-certification regarding status as an employee of public administrations for those intending to make use of the benefits provided by the PA 110 e lode Memorandum of Understanding, issued pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445/2000 (where applicable);
 - ✓ for those intending to make use of the aids referred to in paragraph 2.3, a copy of the disability certificate or Law 104/92 certificate issued in accordance with the law.

All candidates shall be conditionally admitted to the selection procedure.

The Administration may at any time, by reasoned measure, order exclusion for lack of the prescribed requirements. Such measure shall be communicated to the person concerned by certified email.

Likewise, should the documentation submitted by the applicant contain false or untruthful declarations, without prejudice to the penalties provided by the Penal Code and special laws on the matter (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree no. 445/2000), and to the declarant's exposure to claims for damages by interested third parties, any enrolment at the School shall be cancelled, any granted benefits shall be recovered, and the tuition fees and university contributions paid shall be retained, including the sum of EUR 50.00 paid as a contribution for participation in the selection procedure.

ART. 4. SELECTION COMMITTEE

The Selection Committee is composed of the members of the Technical-Scientific Committee, with the support of the administrative secretariat. The names are indicated in the sheet attached to this Call.

ART. 5. LIST OF ADMITTED CANDIDATES - GENERAL MERIT RANKING

Candidates who, in relation to the number of available places, are placed within the last useful position in the ranking drawn up on the basis of the overall score obtained following the assessment of qualifications shall be admitted to the Master's Programme. The ranking shall be drawn up only if the number of applications exceeds the maximum number of available places.

The general merit ranking shall be made known by publication on the University website in the news and notices section of the page dedicated to the Master's Programme, available at the link <https://www.unime.it/didattica/post-laurea/corsi-di-alta-formazione-master-e-corsi-di-perfezionamento>.

The above publication shall constitute the sole official means of publicizing the results of



the admission tests.

Candidates placed in a useful position must enrol in the specialization course within the mandatory deadline and according to the procedures referred to in the following Art. 6 of this call, "ONLINE ENROLMENT PROCEDURE".

ART. 6. ONLINE ENROLMENT PROCEDURE

All candidates usefully placed in the ranking must enrol by no later than the deadline indicated in paragraph 3.1, using EXCLUSIVELY the online procedure by connecting to the website <https://unime.esse3.cineca.it/Home.do>.

Through the aforesaid procedure, the following must be carried out:

- ✓ payment of the first instalment of university fees (including the Regional Fee for the right to study, virtual stamp duty and insurance), through the PagoPA payment procedure;
- ✓ upload of a photocopy of the identity document and tax code of the persons concerned;
- ✓ for those residing abroad, upload of a copy of the official Italian tax code and residence permit.

Anyone who fails to comply with the above within the established deadline shall be deemed to have withdrawn.

Following withdrawal from enrolment by the successful candidates, and in all other cases where the places put out in this call become vacant, the competent Office shall publish a notice of the scrolling of the merit ranking, up to the stated maximum number of enrolments, on the University website and, in particular, in the sheet dedicated to the Master's Programme available from the page <https://www.unime.it/didattica/post-laurea/corsi-di-alta-formazione-master-e-corsi-di-perfezionamento>, so that the candidates immediately following in the ranking may proceed with enrolment within the deadline indicated in the notice.

ART. 7. FEES AND CONTRIBUTIONS FOR ATTENDANCE

7.1 PAYMENT METHODS

Those who enrol in a Master's Programme are required to pay the fees and contributions established in the sheets attached to this Call, which may be paid as follows:

- first instalment of five hundred euro (EUR 500.00), to be paid at the time of enrolment. Late payment of this instalment is not allowed; failure to pay by the aforesaid deadline shall be considered withdrawal from attendance of the Master's Programme;
- second instalment of five hundred euro (EUR 500.00), to be paid within three months of the date of enrolment.
- third instalment of five hundred euro (EUR 500.00), to be paid by 10/01/2027.
- fourth instalment of five hundred euro (EUR 500.00), to be paid by 30/03/2027.
- fifth instalment of five hundred euro (EUR 500.00), to be paid by 30/06/2027

Payment of the first enrolment instalment must be made mandatorily at the time of enrolment.

7.2 INSURANCE COVERAGE



All students enrolled at the University are covered by a specific insurance policy for accidents connected with training activities.

ART. 8. FINAL EXAMINATION AND AWARD OF THE QUALIFICATION

At the end of each teaching module, an assessment test is scheduled. At the conclusion of the training path, each candidate shall prepare a paper that will be evaluated by the members of the Technical-Scientific Committee. At the end of the Master's Programme, the Technical-Scientific Committee shall assign the candidate a final grade out of 110, with the possibility of awarding top marks with honours.

ART. 9 APPOINTMENT OF THE PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PROCEDURE

Pursuant to Law 241/90, the person responsible for the administrative procedure is identified as follows:

- the Director of the Master's Programme for the procedure relating to admission up to publication of the ranking;
- the Head of the Master's Operating Unit, Dr Maria Franzò, with regard to publication of this call on the University website, the collection and forwarding of admission applications, and the procedure relating to the enrolment phase.

Candidates have the right to exercise access to the documents of the selection procedure according to the methods provided for by Chapter V of Law no. 241/90 as well as by the implementing Regulation referred to in Presidential Decree no. 184/2006.

For the acts of the procedure subject to publication obligations under Art. 19, paragraphs 1 and 2, Legislative Decree 33/2013, the method of access is governed by the aforesaid legislative decree.

ART. 9. PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

The processing of candidates' personal data shall be carried out in compliance with European Regulation 679/2016 on the protection of personal data.

The relevant information notice, which can be consulted when submitting the application, is available in the University's privacy section at the link <http://www.unime.it/it/ateneo/privacy>.

The provision of the personal data indicated in the call and in the enrolment procedure on the esse3 platform is mandatory for participation in the procedure itself and every consequential operation, including determination of the score achieved following the admission tests.

The personal data provided on the esse3 platform may also be processed by the University for the institution's own institutional purposes.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Possession of a first-level degree or higher qualification, a first-level academic diploma, or another equivalent qualification or foreign qualification recognized as suitable under the regulations in force

PURPOSE

The Master's Programme will provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to undertake professional careers in public and private sectors as investment analysts, financing analysts and managers in the corporate, banking and financial sector. Students will be provided with the skills and knowledge necessary to face the world of work with a more specific focus on tools for analysing banking, financial and macroeconomic phenomena through the use of data analysis software.

During the training path, students will be constantly assisted by the teaching staff, classroom instructors and tutors in all aspects connected with the course itself. The Director of the Master's Programme (or a delegate) will meet students periodically in order to promptly resolve any learning and adaptation issues, both at entry, during the programme and upon completion.

The training path will be enriched by participation in internships, organized thanks to the numerous agreements in force between the University of Messina and many public and private bodies.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The Master's Programme will enable students to acquire the training necessary to professionally manage assets of any size and to evaluate investments and financing strategies.

The course is aimed both at professionals in the banking and financial sector and at graduates,



even without previous work experience, who intend to:

- a) Specialize in the banking and financial sector;
- b) Manage investment portfolios;
- c) Provide advice on investment strategies and capital structure.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The programme aims to provide knowledge of:

- 1) Financial and banking systems of advanced and developing economies
- 2) Valuation techniques used in financial markets
- 3) Strategic decisions in financial contexts
- 4) Appropriate statistical tools
- 5) Risk management techniques

In addition, the Programme aims to provide practical skills such as:

- 6) Testing financial theories
- 7) Use of statistical and econometric packages
- 8) Knowledge and use of large datasets
- 9) Managerial skills
- 10) Time-management skills

The Corporate Finance and Investment Management modules provide students with the knowledge required to assess the behaviour of companies in competitive and globalized markets, studying the various corporate policies and investment strategies. The Macrofinance and Asset and Risk Management courses enable students to understand the macroeconomic impact of financial markets and to evaluate investment strategies, which are especially necessary for working as asset managers, financial advisors and financial analysts. The Statistics for Economics and Finance and Advanced Statistical Methods for Applied Finance courses offer the knowledge necessary for the implementation and testing of financial theories. They also accustom students to using specific econometric packages, as well as managing and analysing large datasets. Study will be not only theoretical but also applied, through the use, among others, of Stata software, using the computer laboratory at the Department of Economics, equipped with about 30 computers for which the related software licences have been purchased. The Mathematics for Economics and Finance course will focus on the study and use of Matlab software with the aim of learning techniques for simulating and evaluating financial variables. In this case, the Master's Programme will make use of the campus-wide Matlab licence purchased by the University, thus allowing students to use the great potential of this software directly on their personal computers. Finally, the Banking Regulation course will provide the economic and legal knowledge necessary to understand the transformation of banking systems, also through the analysis of the Basel Accords.
