SECTION 1: CHARACTERISTICS OF ERASMUS MOBILITY FOR PLACEMENTS

This call for applications falls under the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme, governed by [Regulation \(EU\) No 2021/817 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 May 2021](#) and by [the Erasmus+ Programme Guide 2021-2027](#).

Individual learning mobility forms part of Action 1 under the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme. This action supports the mobility of students in any subject area and at any level of study (first, second and third cycle).

The aim of this action is to contribute to the creation of a European Education Area and to strengthen the link between education and research, with a view to promoting critical thinking skills.

Art. 1 - General Information

Under the Erasmus+ KA131 Programme, the ‘Erasmus+ Traineeship’ mobility scheme enables UniMe students, PhD candidates and postgraduate students to undertake a training placement at companies, professional practices, research institutes, universities and training centres based in one of the countries participating in the Programme.

In particular, the host organisation may be any public or private organisation active in the labour market or in sectors such as education, training and youth; a non-profit organisation, an association or an NGO; a body providing career guidance, professional advice and information services; a higher education institution in a Programme country holding an Erasmus Charter¹; the Council of Europe, the United Nations, and bodies affiliated with the UN and UNESCO.

The fundamental objective of this initiative is to align the training of university students with European labour market standards, equipping them with specific professional skills and paying particular attention to the culture and socio-economic conditions of each host country.

The University of Messina guarantees equal treatment between men and women.

Students enrolled on a first-cycle degree programme (Bachelor’s degree), second-cycle (Master’s degree and single-cycle degree) or third-cycle (PhD) programmes, may undertake one or more periods of Erasmus+ mobility (‘Student Mobility for Studies’ and/or ‘Student Mobility for Traineeships’) for a maximum of 12 months per cycle of study. Students on single-cycle degree programmes may undertake a total period of Erasmus+ mobility for a maximum of 24 months.

Erasmus+ grants for study and traineeships may be awarded within the same or different study cycles and without a specific sequence, provided that the traineeship mobility is not undertaken at the same time as the Erasmus+ study period.

Art. 2 - Duration of the placement (SMP), eligible training activities and digital skills

Grants will be awarded, **subject to the availability of funds**, to students, undergraduates, postgraduates and PhD students enrolled at the University of Messina to undertake physical mobility (so-called ‘Long mobility’ and ‘Short mobility’).

In particular, **a maximum of 5 grants** will be awarded to **PhD students** and **5 grants to postgraduate students**. Should funds remain, these numbers may be increased until funds are exhausted. Conversely, if grants are not awarded, these funds will be used to finance the mobility of undergraduates and final-year students. Within the scope of eligible mobility activities, a distinction is made between:

- 1) **“Long mobility”**: this refers to the “traditional” Erasmus mobility carried out in person at the host institution/company for a minimum duration of 2 months (60 days) up to a maximum of 4 months (120 days). The rules are those set out in the Programme Guide.
- 2) **“Short mobility”**: the programme allows for short-term internship mobility (from 5 to 30 days), **open exclusively to PhD students and postgraduate students**.

Internships must commence on or after **1 October 2026** and must be completed by **31 July 2027**.

The following activities may be carried out under the Erasmus+ Traineeship mobility scheme: training and career guidance placements, curricular placements, and thesis research activities. Hereinafter, the term “traineeship” shall refer to all the activities mentioned above.

The European Commission promotes the development of digital skills through direct experience within host organisations. **Digital Skills** aim to develop advanced technological competencies through one of the following activities: digital marketing; digital graphic design; application development, installation, maintenance and management of IT systems and networks; data analytics and visualisation; programming and training of robots and artificial intelligence applications.

The activity carried out as part of the Erasmus+ Traineeship may therefore, for all intents and purposes, replace the “Curricular Internship” and lead to the award of curricular ECTS credits, or it may be recognised as an ex-post internship and result in the award of additional (extracurricular) ECTS credits which do not count towards the degree but are recorded in the Diploma Supplement.

Art. 3 – Admission Requirements

The following students, undergraduates, PhD students and postgraduate students who meet the requirements listed below may undertake the Erasmus+ traineeship:

- **Students**: Must be duly enrolled, whether on or behind schedule, for the 2025/26 academic year on a first-cycle, second-cycle or single-cycle degree programme. Students enrolled on single-subject courses are not eligible.
- **Final-year undergraduates**: Final-year undergraduates are defined as students who will obtain their final degree after participating in the call for applications and who must undertake mobility exclusively after graduation. Such candidates may apply and must be enrolled in the final year of a first-cycle, second-cycle or single-cycle degree programme for the 2025/26 academic year. Therefore, **they may be selected and awarded a grant only if they do not obtain their degree before**



the publication of the rankings and may undertake the placement within twelve months of obtaining their final degree and, in any case, no later than 31 July 2027.

- **PhD students:** Must be enrolled in a PhD programme and complete the mobility period no later than the end of the third year of enrolment. Before submitting an application, these candidates must obtain authorisation to undertake mobility abroad from the PhD Programme Coordinator/Supervisor.
- **Postgraduate students:** The student must be enrolled on a postgraduate programme run by UNIME in the 2025/2026 academic year and must remain enrolled for the entire duration of the procedure, i.e. until the ranking list is published. Before submitting their application, these candidates must obtain authorisation to undertake a study placement abroad from the Coordinator/Supervisor of their postgraduate programme.

ALL candidates must:

- Carry out all communications via **UNIME's institutional email (nome.cognome@studenti.unime.it)**;
- Have completed payment of fees in accordance with their '**STATUS**' (**Undergraduates, Final-year Undergraduates, PhD Students and Specialisation Students**) at the time of application, at the time of departure and for the entire duration of the mobility period;
- Possess a level of language proficiency appropriate to the host country of the chosen institution, in line with the provisions of Article 6;
- Not have already used up the maximum number of mobility months provided for by the Erasmus+ Programme for each cycle of study (see Article 1);
- Submit their "work plan" (see Annex 2 "Learning Agreement for Traineeship") duly completed and **signed by the host institution and the International Mobility Coordinator (the Institutional Coordinator's signature is not required at the time of application)**;
- Students who are non-EU citizens must also hold a **valid residence permit** at the time of application and for the entire duration of the mobility period. **The residence permit must be renewed before the start of the mobility period. It is therefore advisable to arrange for renewal well in advance of the departure date.**

Throughout the Erasmus period, the student may NOT:

1. Take courses or sit exams at UNIME, as their academic record will be frozen on Esse3 for the entire duration of the mobility period and will only be unblocked upon receipt of the end-of-mobility certificate.
2. Graduate.

Art. 4 – Financial Aspects

Erasmus+ mobility grants for placements funded by the European Commission are intended as a contribution towards additional mobility costs (travel, accommodation, difference in cost of living) and therefore do not cover the full cost of the stay abroad.



Payment of the grant will be subject to the transfer of the relevant funds by the Indire National Agency and will be made in a single instalment.

The disbursement of the monthly EU grant is subject to the signing of the Financial Agreement between the University of Messina and the beneficiary (the student). The Financial Agreement must be sent exclusively from the student's institutional email address (nome.cognome@studenti.unime.it) before the start of the mobility period to the Mobility for Internships Unit, which will forward the document for final signature by the Head of the Teaching and Higher Education Services Department. Details on how to submit the Financial Agreement will be communicated promptly by email to scholarship recipients. The total amount of the grant will be paid upon receipt by the relevant department of *the 'Confirmation of Arrival'* for the student on mobility.

Upon return, all documentation submitted will be verified; should the student terminate the mobility period earlier than the dates specified in the financial agreement, a refund of the sums paid for the unused period of mobility may be requested. The monthly amount of the European grant is determined based on the cost of living in the destination country, according to three groups predefined by the European Commission.

4.1 Grant for long-term mobility – “Long mobility” – (All mobility programmes)

The grant for Erasmus+ Traineeship “Long mobility” consists of the following components:

Monthly EU grant allocated by the Erasmus+ National Agency/INDIRE. This component is paid to all successful applicants of the Erasmus+ Traineeship Call for Applications for the 2026/2027 academic year; it varies according to the destination country and corresponds to the following amounts:

4.2 Grant for short-term mobility “Short mobility” (for PhD and postgraduate students only): The grant for short-term mobility “Short mobility” is calculated based on the duration of the in-person placement, as shown in the table below:

Up to the 14th day	€79
From the 15th to the 30th day of activity	€56

No financial contribution is provided for the virtual component of short-term mobility.

4.3 Support for students with fewer opportunities:

For students and PhD candidates with fewer opportunities (with special needs relating to physical, mental or health conditions), in addition to the Erasmus+ financial contribution for physical mobility, a supplement of €250.00 per month is provided.

The European Commission also allocates an additional annual sum to provide larger grants for students with special needs. Students wishing to apply for such funding should contact the ‘Disability/DSD Services’ Unit (email: servizi.dd@unime.it), which, in consultation with the relevant department, will assist students in finalising their applications and requesting additional grants.

4.4 Grants for PhD students:

The Erasmus+ grant for the third cycle is not compatible with the supplement provided for PhD students receiving a grant, but it is compatible with the contribution provided by the PhD programme towards living expenses abroad, in accordance with the regulations (Article 21, paragraph 10) of UNIME. Students/PhD candidates awarded an Erasmus+ mobility grant for a placement (SMP) may not simultaneously receive grants or funding made available by the European Commission under other programmes.

4.5 TRAVEL GRANT amount

The Travel Grant is a contribution payable to all selected participants, the amount of which varies according to the **distance bracket** corresponding to the distance between the University of Messina and the Erasmus+ destination. There are two types of Travel Grant:

“Standard”

- A one-off grant awarded, without the need to submit proof of expenditure, to **all recipients** using standard means of transport (such as flights, etc.) to reach their Erasmus+ destination, based on the distance of the journey.
- Applications for travel undertaken for occasional returns (e.g. Christmas holidays, weekends, etc.) will not be considered eligible



The amounts of the Standard Travel Grant per participant are set out in the table below:

“Green”

The Erasmus+ 2021/2027 programme aims to encourage green transport, i.e. modes of travel using low-carbon transport (such as trains, car sharing and buses). The one-off grant is awarded to those who use low-environmental-impact transport such as trains, car-sharing, buses, etc. (excluding ships and aeroplanes) to reach their Erasmus+ destination.

- The journey must be undertaken at the start of the mobility period within a maximum of 30 days prior to the start date of the mobility as certified by the Mobility Declaration and/or in relation to the return journey undertaken within a maximum of 30 days from the end date of the mobility as certified by the Mobility Declaration.
- Applications for travel undertaken for occasional returns (e.g. Christmas, Easter, weekends, etc.) will not be considered eligible.
- For this type of travel, you must keep the relevant expense receipts to prove that the journey was indeed eco-friendly. These receipts will be requested by the Mobility for Internships Unit at the end of the mobility period.

The amounts and requirements of the ‘Green’ Travel Grant per participant are set out in the table below:

Art. 5 – Choice of location and duration of the period

Each candidate must:

1. Find, either independently or with the support of a tutor, an organisation willing to host them for the placement activities (hereinafter referred to as the ‘Host Organisation’) in one of the countries participating in the Erasmus+ KA131 Programme, which meets the requirements set out in Article 1, paragraph 1.

To identify a Host Organisation, students may:

- Consult the **Database UNIME** available online following [following page](https://www.unime.it/international/opportunita-allestero/erasmus/mobilita-erasmus-tirocinio-ue/database-sedi-ospitanti) : <https://www.unime.it/international/opportunita-allestero/erasmus/mobilita-erasmus-tirocinio-ue/database-sedi-ospitanti> which lists the details of the host institutions that have collaborated with the University of Messina in previous academic years.
- Please consult the platforms **sponsored by the European Commission and ErasmusIntern** (<https://erasmusintern.org/>), which list the internship positions available at European institutions and organisations. These platforms also detail internship opportunities for developing **digital skills**.

2. Agree the Learning Agreement for Traineeship (LAT) with the academic supervisor responsible for international mobility on your degree programme/PhD course, setting out the work plan you intend to carry out abroad.

The procedures for completing the LAT are set out in Annex 4 to this Call for Applications.

Only applications accompanied by a Learning Agreement for Traineeship, duly completed in all sections (including the ‘Before the Mobility’ section, Table A and Table B), and bearing the signatures of the trainee, the mobility coordinator for the



mobility (Erasmus mobility coordinator of the degree course) and the host organisation (supervisor at the receiving organisation).

At the time of application, the signature of the institutional coordinator is not required on the Learning Agreement for Traineeship.

Any period during which the host organisation is closed, whether for holidays or other valid reasons, cannot be taken into account when calculating the minimum duration required for each traineeship (60 days).

Recipients of a mobility grant who terminate their stay abroad prematurely, voluntarily and without a valid and documented reason will forfeit any entitlement to the financial benefit and will be required to repay the full amount of the grant.

Only in the event of an interruption to the mobility programme due to serious reasons or force majeure (unforeseeable events not attributable to the beneficiary's error or negligence, such as national strikes, natural disasters, or other circumstances not directly linked to the beneficiary's will), provided they are adequately documented, will the Erasmus National Agency issue a specific opinion regarding the possible confirmation of the grant for the period of the placement actually completed.

The beneficiary may request, with adequate justification, an extension of their mobility period from the relevant department. Any extension granted must be authorised by both the University of Messina and the host organisation and will be paid upon completion of all funded mobility periods, subject to the availability of EU funding.

Art. 6 – Language Proficiency

Knowledge of the official language of the host country, or any other language accepted by the host institution as a 'working language', is a requirement for applying for the call.

3. Letter of commitment to achieving the language level required by the assigned host institution (complete Annex 2).

Furthermore, participation in the call is permitted without specific language proficiency. The student undertakes to achieve and certify the necessary language level through the three options set out in Annex 2 of the Call:

- Passing a test administered by the University Language Centre (CLA) as indicated by the Mobility for Internship Unit, to be held in July. The candidate will be contacted by the CLA via an email sent to their institutional email address (... @studenti.unime.it).
- Passing an internal examination
- Obtaining an international certification (Art. 6(1))

STRICTLY before the start date of the mobility programme, failing which the grant will be revoked.

Pursuant to Presidential Decree 445/2000 – Article 46 of Presidential Decree 1972, you must complete either Annex 1 or 2 to self-certify your level of language proficiency, as demonstrated by the methods outlined above.

Native speakers may self-certify their knowledge and level of language proficiency using Annex 1.

The online application procedure (see Art. 7) requires the upload of the language certificate or self-certification for the foreign language you wish to declare proficiency in. Applications without an upload, or with a language certificate other than those listed above or self-certification, will be excluded.

SECTION 2: SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

This Call for Applications provides for a single CALL for the submission of applications.

Students wishing to apply must submit their application via the Esse3 platform

<https://unime.esse3.cineca.it/Home.do> by **10 June 2026** at 13:00. (departure from 1 October 2026)

The application must include the following, **failing which it will be excluded**:

- Certification/Self-certification of language proficiency (Annexes 1 or 2).
- The details of the host organisation where the placement is to be carried out (see Annex 4: Guidelines for completing the Erasmus+ Application), specifying, in the relevant section, the country of the host organisation.
- *Learning Agreement for Traineeship (LAT) duly completed and signed by the host organisation and the International Mobility Coordinator (the Institutional Coordinator's signature is not required at the time of application)*; (NB: it is mandatory to complete sections 'Table A' and 'Table B' of the LAT) (Annex 3)
- Details of any previous participation in mobility periods under the Erasmus programme;
- Information regarding any disabilities.



In addition to the documents already mentioned, PhD students must attach to their application the authorisation from their supervisor to undertake the period abroad.

Instructions on how to complete the application via Esse3 are set out in *the “Guidelines for completing the Erasmus+ application”* (Annex 4).

Art. 7 – Selection criteria for applications and ranking lists

Selection will be based on an assessment of the candidates’ academic record in accordance with the formulas for calculating merit scores (see Annex 6), taking into account the data in ESSE3 (*student career database*) as of the application deadline.

Participants, in particular PhD and postgraduate students, are invited to verify the accuracy of the data in ESSE3 relating to their degree classification.

Students aware of any discrepancies in the recording of exams taken are required to request the correction of their academic record by contacting the Student Office and/or the relevant academic department before completing their application.

An additional 3 points will be awarded to candidates who intend to undertake a traineeship aimed at acquiring digital skills.

In the event of equal merit, priority will be given to the younger candidate.

The University Erasmus Committee will approve the merit ranking. Any changes to data relating to academic activities recorded after the application deadline will not be taken into account for the purposes of compiling the ranking.

The merit ranking will be published, **in good time to allow for departures from 1 October 2026**, on the website at the following link: <https://www.unime.it/bandi-e-concorsi/studenti>

Such publications shall constitute legal notice, in accordance with the Digital Administration Code (Legislative Decree No. 82 of 7 March 2005, as amended and supplemented), and shall serve as notification to all successful candidates. It is the student’s responsibility to review the ranking list.

Please note that the Administration is required to carry out appropriate checks on the accuracy of the content of the declarations received and that, in addition to the loss of any benefits obtained on the basis of a false declaration, the criminal penalties provided for in cases of forgery and false declarations shall apply. In such cases, students who have already received financial support will be excluded from participation in the programme and will be required to repay in full the amounts already received.

Art. 8 – Ranking list updates

The relevant administrative department will update the ranking list in order to reallocate any monthly payments that remain unallocated following beneficiaries’ withdrawal, until the available funds are exhausted.



SECTION 3: ADMINISTRATIVE AND REGULATORY ASPECTS

Art. 9 – Insurance Cover

Erasmus+ mobility grant recipients are covered by an accident and civil liability insurance policy, paid for by the University of Messina, valid for the entire duration of their stay abroad, whilst exclusively carrying out the activities set out in their work plan.

Any additional ‘special’ insurance cover required by the host institution shall, however, be borne exclusively by the student.
