- IN VIEW OF** Law no. 240 of 30 December 2010, which provides for the strengthening of internationalization also through greater student mobility;

**FOREWORD**

*This call refers to mobilities that will take place in the academic year 2026/2027. The actual possibility of carrying out the mobility is linked to the evolution of the international situation generated, among other things, as a result of the ongoing conflicts and the health condition of the individual countries and universities of destination. In this context, it should be noted that mobilities may be subject to changes and/or cancellations if the need arises or the partner so arranges, in compliance with the indications of National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI) and other local or national provisions.*

**DECREE**

**Art. 1 – Object**

1. For the Academic Year 2026/2027, a selection is announced for third-cycle students<sup>1</sup> (see art.2) of the University of Messina for the assignment of Erasmus+ KA171 mobility grants for study and traineeship in non-European countries, funded by the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE, according to the methods and conditions set out below.
2. This call governs the selection for the award of mobility grants for study (Erasmus+ Study) and for traineeship (Erasmus+ Traineeship)<sup>2</sup> to the following countries and institutions and for the activities indicated (more information is available in Annex 1 which is an integral part of the call):

3. The number of scholarships and the number of months/days per single mobility will be defined on the basis of the requests received until the maximum budget available per country is reached.
4. Should the number of mobilities requested be higher than the maximum budget available for each country and indicated in the table above, the Commission will evaluate the possibility of allocating a larger budget, in compliance with the total funding received for each country and the rules for transferring funds provided for by the Erasmus+ Programme (Articles 5.5 of Conventions 2024-1-IT02-KA171-HED-000206831 and 2025-1-IT02-KA171-HED-000335233).
5. To candidates who, based on the final ranking, are eligible for funding but not assigned any destination, the office may propose another Host University among the remaining destinations and for which the candidates meet the specific requirements required by the Host University.
6. **Mobilities can only begin after the official publication of the results of the selections and the consequent administrative activities, and must take into account the academic calendar of the Host University. In any case, the activities must be completed by 31 July 2027.**

## Art. 2 – Recipients and general admission requirements

1. Students meeting the following general requirements are admitted to the selection:
  - a) be enrolled in a Third Cycle Course (PhD Course, Postgraduate School) at the time of application and for the entire duration of their stay abroad;
  - b) the requirement of enrolment for the entire duration of the stay abroad does not apply to PhD students and postgraduate students enrolled in the last year of the Third Cycle Course who will carry out the traineeship after obtaining the final degree ("post-degree traineeship"). The traineeship must be carried out within 12 months from that date and, in any case, **no later than 31 July 2027**;
  - c) language competence (see art. 10) required by the Host university where the mobility period is to be undertaken, as specified **in Annex 1** to this call;
  - d) not having already used up the maximum number of mobility months allowed by the Erasmus+ Programme during one's study cycle (maximum 12 months per study cycle). **The periods of**



**Erasmus+ Extra-EU Mobility are in addition to those already taken under the Erasmus+ programme with European universities.**

- 2. Before departure, students awarded a grant must be in good standing with regard to their enrolment (not on a provisional basis) and the payment of fees, under penalty of forfeiture of the scholarship, except as provided for in the aforementioned letter b).**
- 3. Students from countries outside the European Union, in the event of the assignment of an Erasmus+ scholarship, will have to regularize their position (renewal of residence permit, visa, etc.) before departure and for the entire duration of the mobility period abroad. In any case, students residing in the country where the Erasmus+ mobility is intended to be carried out will not be admitted to the selection.**
4. Selected students must compulsorily carry out the mobility during the course of study to which they belong at the time of submission of the application. This obligation does not apply to students who will carry out a "post-degree traineeship" in compliance with the provisions of paragraph 1, letter b).
5. Those who intend to participate in the "post-degree traineeship" **must** obtain the final title (PhD or specialization) **no earlier than 2 months** from the date of submission of the application to the following Call for Applications, under penalty of ineligibility of any contribution awarded following the selection. Therefore, at least 2 months must elapse between the date of submission of the application and the achievement of the final qualification. In the absence of the aforementioned time requirement, the candidate will forfeit any benefit assigned.
6. The University of Messina guarantees equal opportunities and equal access, inclusion, diversity and equity.

### **Art. 3 – Specific requirements**

1. To participate in this Call for Applications, it is necessary to meet the specific requirements as indicated in **Annex 1** for each Host University.

### **Art. 4 – Choice of destinations**

1. Each candidate will be able to choose a location in which to carry out the mobility, depending on the course to which they belong and on the basis of the available educational offer (see **Annex 1**).
2. During the application phase, the student is recommended to define a draft Learning Agreement with the Coordinator/Contact Person of the third-cycle course of study to which he/she belongs. In the drafting of the document he will be supported by the Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit. **Candidates will take care to verify that they meet the general and specific requirements referred to in articles 2-3 of this Announcement.**

### **Art. 5 – General Information and duration of the mobility**

1. **Without prejudice to the deadline for the conclusion of the mobility on 31 July 2027**, mobility can be of two types:
  - a. *Long mobility*: minimum mandatory duration of 2 months (60 days) and maximum duration of 12 months (360 days);
  - b. *Short mobility*: mandatory minimum duration of 5 days and maximum of 30 days.
2. Students may choose to undertake, at the available destinations, either a *long-term* or a *short-term mobility*.
3. Mobility as defined in point 1 may be associated with a period of virtual mobility, if authorized by the host institution, for which no financial contribution will be recognized.



4. During the mobility and at least 1 month before the end of the initially planned mobility, the student has the right to request the extension of his/her period of stay up to a maximum of 12 months at the host institution **and, in any case, by 31 July 2027**, which may be granted by the University, within the limits established by the Erasmus+ Programme, by art.2.1 of this Call and within the budget available by country.

#### **Art. 6 – Activities allowed during mobility**

1. During the mobility period, the student can attend full-time courses of study at the Host University; carry out activities aimed at writing the thesis; thesis research activities; training and career guidance traineeships; other activities aimed at obtaining the Degree. A mobility for study purposes may include a complementary traineeship period, where applicable (combined mobility).

*N.B. Students who wish to participate in the Erasmus+ Call for **Thesis Research** are required to **verify** the feasibility of their research project in advance with the Course Coordinator. It is understood that the host universities will, ultimately, assess whether or not to admit each candidate for thesis research.*

2. Students will obtain academic recognition of the activities carried out abroad, in accordance with the University Regulations "[Recognition of mobility periods abroad](#)" (Rector's Decree no. 83 of 17.01.2018), as well as the Regulations of the Courses of Study in which they are enrolled, and the related Study/Training Plans approved by the competent bodies, where applicable, provided that they have successfully completed such activities. To this end, each student awarded a mobility scholarship must agree a study/traineeship programme (*Learning Agreement, see art. 6 of the Regulations*) with the Coordinator of the course of study, which must be clearly defined **before** departure, in agreement with each Host University (cf. **Annex 1**).
3. The period of study/ traineeship abroad is an integral part of the educational path of each student and is fully recognized for academic purposes.
4. During the entire Erasmus mobility period, the student will **NOT** be able to obtain the title of the III cycle course in which he or she is enrolled.

#### **Art. 7 – Equivalence of studies and services**

1. Students awarded an Erasmus+ scholarship have the "status" of Erasmus student, benefiting from the following rights:
  - at the Host University: exemption from the payment of tuition fees (except for any specific fees required); extension of the University's insurance coverage for civil liability and accidents whilst carrying out the agreed activities abroad;
  - at UniME: recognition of the period spent abroad, in accordance with the University Regulations on "[Recognition of mobility periods abroad](#)" and the Regulations of the Courses of Study in which they are enrolled.
2. The rights and obligations of Erasmus students are set out in the "Erasmus Student Charter", available at the following link: <https://erasmus-plus.ec.europa.eu/it/carta-dello-studente-erasmus-0>

#### **Art. 8 – Financial Contributions for mobility in Programme Partner Countries**



1. **Erasmus+ mobility grants** funded by the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE are intended as a **contribution towards additional mobility costs** (*travel, accommodation, difference in cost of living*) and **therefore do not cover the full cost of the study period abroad.**
2. The contribution to mobility is linked to the actual participation in the study/traineeship activities and is structured as follows:

a)

- b) contribution for travel expenses, based on the distance in kilometers between the city of departure and the city of destination as established by the Distance Calculator prepared by the European Commission ([http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance\\_en.htm](http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm)) according to the following table:

\*Green travel is defined as travel made, for the most part, by low-emission means of transport, such as bus, train, bike or carpooling. In addition to the increase in the travel contribution, participants can receive individual support to cover their accommodation expenses for a maximum of six days of travel, upon presentation of a specific self-certification.

- c) reimbursement of expenses incurred for the stipulation of compulsory health insurance, upon presentation of suitable proof of expenditure up to a maximum amount of €150.00.
3. The contribution will be paid as follows:
    - 70% of the total amount will be paid before the start of the mobility period, to which will be added the reimbursement of expenses incurred for the stipulation of compulsory health insurance;
    - where possible, the remaining 30% will be paid by the end of the mobility period; otherwise, upon the student's return, based on the actual duration of the mobility period.
  4. At the end of the mobility period, all financial contributions will be adjusted to the actual duration of the period, calculated on the basis of the days of stay certified by the Host University. Any sums received but not due will be reclaimed, in accordance with the procedures communicated by the Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit.



5. The student who has actually spent less than 5 days abroad in the case of *short mobility* or less than 2 months (60 days) in the case of *long mobility* **will have** to return the Erasmus+ mobility grant in full. Cases in which the interruption is due to documented force majeure and promptly communicated to the UniME Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit are excluded; in such cases, the financial contribution for the mobility period actually carried out abroad will be recognized only following approval by the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE.
6. The Erasmus+ scholarship **cannot be combined** with the increase in the scholarship awarded to PhD students for periods of stay abroad, in compliance with the [Regulations for the PhD Courses at the University of Messina](#) (Rector's Decree no. 645 of 10 March 2025), nor with any other scholarship and/or contribution granted to the student for the purpose of study/traineeship/research abroad. For RFF/PNRR scholarship holders and beneficiaries of a scholarship funded by European funds, the Erasmus+ mobility period **cannot coincide** with periods abroad financed with RFF/PNRR funds (or other European funds), nor reported on such funding.

#### **Art. 9 - Supplementary contribution for students with fewer opportunities**

1. In line with the European Commission's "Implementation guidelines - Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps Inclusion and Diversity Strategy" and with the inclusion principles expressed in the ECHE, the Erasmus+ Programme recognizes an additional contribution for students with fewer opportunities in order to facilitate access to mobility. The supplementary contribution aims to provide a tool to overcome the obstacles that different target groups may face in accessing these opportunities and will be awarded to the selected students throughout the duration of the mobility.
2. This financial contribution will be awarded, subject to the availability of funding for each country, to students who fall into one of the categories listed below. Students who fall into one of the categories listed below must **fill in the appropriate self-certification form or attach the necessary documentation during the application phase**. Students belonging to more than one of the categories mentioned below may claim the contributions for students with fewer opportunities, with reference to only one of the following categories:
  - I. **students in disadvantaged economic conditions** who meet the requirements indicated in MUR Ministerial Decree no. 176 of 10 February 2026, namely those with an ISEE  $\leq$  €28,339.88. Reference is made to the ISEE, associated with the last academic year and present on Esse3 at the time of the application deadline. Students who do not have the ISEE uploaded on Esse3 can proceed with the calculation of the ISEE by contacting, for example, a Tax Assistance Center (CAF). In the event of failure to submit the ISEE before the start of the mobility, it will not be possible to proceed with the allocation of the Erasmus+ scholarship supplement.
  - II. Students **with certified special needs (physical, mental, health)**. In this case, the student must attach a medical certificate attesting to the physical condition and/or disability certificate to the application.
  - III. Students who do not fall into the above categories but who are in the following conditions:
    - a) **Students with minor children;**
    - b) **Working students;**
    - c) **Professional student athletes;**
    - d) **Students who have lost at least one parent;**
    - e) **Students who are children of victims of terrorism and organized crime;**
    - f) **Students with refugee status.**



Students who meet the condition described in point III of this article must attach to the application a self-declaration pursuant to Article 46 of Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28 December 2000, accompanied by an explanatory letter.

3. The additional contributions for students with fewer opportunities are structured as follows:

<i>Short mobility</i>	<i>Long mobility</i>
For mobility periods 5-14 days € 100.00	€ 250.00/month
For mobility periods 15-30 days € 150.00	

4. In addition, participants with fewer opportunities will be able to apply for additional support, according to the procedures indicated by the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE, for additional costs directly related to mobility that cannot be covered with the additional amount of €250.00 per month. These costs aim to cover the additional financial support needed (real costs) for participation in the mobility of participants with needs related to physical, mental or health conditions. Travel and accommodation expenses of any accompanying persons are also allowed, if justified. The request, duly justified, must be sent to the Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit ([progetti.erasmusicm@unime.it](mailto:progetti.erasmusicm@unime.it)) and subsequently approved by the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE. In the event of non-approval, no claim can be made against the University of Messina.

#### **Art.10 – Application Procedure and Deadline**

1. In compliance with current legislation, the University of Messina has adapted its IT systems through the implementation of **SPID** which represents the authentication system that allows citizens to access the online services of public administrations with a unique Digital Identity. Applications for participation in the selection process, including the necessary documentation, must be submitted electronically through the Esse3 platform <https://unime.esse3.cineca.it> by:
  - Login with SPID for adult candidates;
  - Login without SPID for foreign citizens.
2. Students wishing to apply must fill in the online application through the **ESSE3** platform by **23:59 on the 30th day following the date of publication of this call for applications**, failing which they will be excluded. After this deadline, the system will no longer be accessible. The delivery of the application in paper format is not required.
3. Applications not received within the time and in the manner established by this announcement will be automatically excluded from the selection process.
4. The application must indicate:
  - i. **Type of mobility chosen:** for study, for traineeship, combined study + traineeship, for post-degree traineeship; candidates for the "post-degree traineeship" must attach a self-certification declaring that they are aware that, for the purposes of eligibility for the contribution and the assignment of the benefit, they must obtain the final title (PhD or specialization) no earlier than 2 months from the date of submission of the application to this Call, under penalty of forfeiture;
  - ii. **Number of days<sup>3</sup>/months requested and the period identified for mobility;**
  - iii. **Self-certification of the degree grades obtained** at the end of the Bachelor's Degree Course and the Master's Degree Course. Students coming from a Single-Cycle Master's Degree Course

will only have to self-certify the degree grade obtained at the end of this Degree Course; **students in possession of a foreign academic qualification** must attach the certificate of qualification(s) held (*Bachelor's and Master's degrees*) indicating: a) the duration of the course of study; b) the list of exams taken with relative marks (*transcript of records*); c) the indication of the University that issued the qualification; d) the date of achievement and the final grade, with an official translation into Italian or English, issued by the University that awarded the degree;

- iv. **Language competence:** knowledge of the foreign language that can be documented in one of the following ways: Language certifications issued by the CLA/CLAM (University Language Centre), specifying the level of knowledge acquired according to the European classification; International certifications; Self-certification certifying the language proficiency required by Annex 1 of the Call for applications or the attendance of a degree course and/or a PhD course entirely taught in a foreign language and/or the status of native speaker of the language of the host institution;
  - v. **Whether or not other scholarships are available, including contributions for stays abroad;**
  - vi. **Learning Agreement for Studies/for Traineeships** already approved by the Coordinator of the course of study. N.B. *for students who intend to carry out a thesis research period, the pre-acceptance of the proposed research (Research Proposal) is also required;*
  - vii. Possible participation in **mobility periods (previous and/or ongoing)** under the Erasmus programme and the duration of the aforementioned periods;
  - viii. **Authorization of the Academic Board** of reference for the period abroad pursuant to the Regulations for the PhD Courses at the University of Messina (Rector's Decree no. 645 of 10 March 2025);
  - ix. **Authorization of the Council of the School of Specialization** to carry out the period abroad if the Regulations of the School of Specialization at the University of Messina provide for it;
  - x. **Belonging to one of the categories** listed in Article 9 for the identification of **students with fewer opportunities**, with attached documentation/self-certification (ISEE-U and further documentation/self-certifications);
  - xi. Any special needs and requirements, duly justified.
5. The application form constitutes a declaration in lieu of certifications (Article 46 of Presidential Decree No. 445 of 28.12.2000); therefore, false declarations, in addition to leading to exclusion from the selection and forfeiture of any benefits obtained on the basis of an untruthful declaration, are criminally sanctioned pursuant to Article 76 of Presidential Decree No. 445 of 28.12.2000.
  6. The University assumes no responsibility for the dispersion of communications due to incorrect indication of the address by the competitor, nor for any misunderstandings attributable to third parties, fortuitous events or force majeure and relating to the submission of the application.
  7. The submission of the application for participation in the selection implies the acceptance by the candidate of the rules contained in this announcement and in the aforementioned rules and regulations. Participation in the procedure implies, as acquired in advance, consent to the release of the documents presented and the acts of the procedure, in the event of a request by the other competitors, pursuant to the legislation on access to documents.
  8. All the documentation relating to this Call for Applications and any updates and/or further specifications will be made available on the University website at: <https://www.unime.it/bande-concorsi>.



#### **Art. 11 – Criteria for the selection of applications**

1. The selection will be made by a special Committee, on the basis of the average of the two degree grades self-certified or certified by the student and obtained upon completion of the Bachelor's Degree Course and the Master's Degree Course, in accordance with the provisions of Article 1 of this Call for Applications. For students coming from a Single-Cycle Master's Degree Course, only the degree grade obtained at the end of this degree course will be considered. For students who have graduated from a foreign university, the "Conversion Table for Foreign Qualifications" provided by the MUR will be used.
2. In the event of a tie, priority will be given to the youngest candidate.
3. The final ranking list will be approved by the Commission.

#### **Art.12 – Rankings and acceptance of the Erasmus+ scholarship**

1. The Rector's Decree approving the acts of the procedure, containing the ranking list with the **assignments** of destinations, will be published on the website <https://www.unime.it/bandi-e-concorsi>. This publication constitutes legal notice, pursuant to the Digital Administration Code (Legislative Decree 235/2011), and shall serve as notification to all successful candidates. It is the student's responsibility to view the ranking list.
2. Students who will be awarded the Erasmus+ scholarship must submit their **acceptance or withdrawal through the ESSE3 platform by the fifth day following the publication of the merit ranking** list on the website <https://www.unime.it/bandi-e-concorsi>. Assignees who fail to meet the deadline for confirming acceptance will be automatically excluded from the rankings, as withdrawers without justified reason, losing any right to current mobility.
3. In the event of a withdrawal and/or forfeiture by the assignee, the destination made available will be assigned to eligible students who are not assigned and who meet the specific requirements of the host institution, according to the order of the ranking list, in compliance with the criteria set out in this Call for Applications.
4. **Acceptance will not guarantee that the student will be able to undertake the mobility: the host university must explicitly confirm that it can accept the student.**
5. The Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit will be responsible for communicating the names of the students assigned ("*Nomination*") to the host universities.

#### **Art. 13 - Change of mobility destination**

1. Without prejudice to the provisions of art. 5 regarding the minimum and maximum duration of the mobility and the deadline for completing it, the change of the Host University is allowed **only** for serious and documented reasons or in the event that the host institution is unable to accommodate the mobility. Assignees forced to change the destination must submit a specific, reasoned request via the University General Protocol to the Extra-EU Mobility Programs Unit ([projects.erasmusicm@unime.it](mailto:projects.erasmusicm@unime.it)). The request will be submitted for assessment by the University Commission; in the absence of such assessment, the request to change the host institution cannot be accepted.



#### **Art. 14 – Insurance coverage**

1. Students on mobility are covered by an insurance policy, paid for by UniME, for accidents and civil liability, valid for the entire period abroad, solely for the purposes of carrying out the activities set out in their study/training plan.
2. Any additional insurance coverage required by the host institution will be borne by the student.
3. Before departure, the student must take out private health insurance valid in the country of destination for the entire period of stay abroad according to the procedures provided by the host country: <https://www.salute.gov.it/new/it/tema/assistenza-sanitaria-paesi-extra-ue/se-parto-perguida-interattiva/>, which will be reimbursed by the University within the limits set out in Art.8, paragraph 2 of this call for applications.
4. It is strongly recommended that students take out private third-party liability insurance. Insurance coverage against the loss or theft of documents, travel documents and luggage is also recommended.

#### **Art. 15 – Information pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 101/2018**

1. Pursuant to art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679, we hereby inform you that this University is the data controller of the personal data provided by the candidate for this selection and that the processing itself will be carried out in compliance with the aforementioned European regulation for the purpose of fulfilling the publication obligations pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 33/2013.
